Istanbul, Turkey

(Will not safe in Athens.)

Bed.

Left Athens bound for Istanbul at 8:20 AM (1:20 EST). Distance of 378 miles.

Crossed Aegean Sea. 9000 feet. Outside temperature 50° F. Airspeed 247 mph. Tailwind of 20 m.p.h. Groundspeed 267.

Istanbul time (same as Athens)  
7 hours ahead of EST

Arrived Istanbul airport 10 A.M. <sup>1/9</sup>  
We had crossed Aegean Sea  
near Smyrna, & gone  
North East to Istanbul.

Drove into Istanbul to Hotel Hilton,  
a fabulously swanky hotel. On  
the way into this city of over  
1 million people, we stopped  
at St. Sophia's Moslem Mosque,  
now a museum. Then to the  
Blue Mosque. One must remove  
shoes before entering. The Moslem  
pray 5 times daily, facing  
towards Mecca. Carpets were  
on floor. A few muslims were  
praying, jostling, reading Koran.

Istanbul - Ankara puzzling,

On to lunch. A boat ride up the Bosphorus to the Black Sea. On returning to Istanbul, we went to the Bazaar & I purchased scarf for Anna, <sup>red</sup> scarf for Dajani & souvenirs. Bazaar closed at 7:00. I will date getting out.

Back to hotel. Write Irma & kids. Bed.

10:30 Left Istanbul airport 10:30 a.m. local time. 225 miles arrived Ankara, 11:30 a.m., sunny. Airport called Esenboga after one of Tamerlane's generals. Tamerlane defeated Beylerbeyi in ~~1402~~ 1402 on the plain where Esenboga airport located. Tamerlane had tents pitched in red hills adjacent. We road from airport into Ankara, the same route traveled on the old trade routes to the

East. Ankara, is the home of the Ankara gear. Unlike Istanbul, Ankara is a planned city except for the old, original ~~city~~ section. The main street was laid out by Ataturk.

We had lunch, then visited office of Prime Minister Menderes.

Visited tomb of Ataturk, then went to the citadel, a very old fortress overlooking the city on the hill. From here one could get a beautiful sweep of the plains and foothills. We then attended the opening of the "Atoms for Peace" exhibit at which President Bayar and Ambassador Warren spoke. Then back to the home of the Ambassador where we were treated to the music of a Turkish orchestra. Turkish folk

Dozens of children, ragged, dirty, hair uncombed. Saw rations being received. Concentrated milk carried in gasoline cans, oil cans, any type can which might be utilized.

Wunched truck located on plain of Moab. Crossed Jordan river there,

quite cold day. Visited excavation

In it stand two male grave significantly, one, the water of life, destined of woman, & who here stays 15 seconds to die out.

Captain's name of his favorite wife, AFGHAN AND BHADRI Begum, better known as MUMTAZ MAHAL ornament of the palace.


