A BILL

- To provide for the establishment and administration of the Allegheny Parkway in the States of West Virginia and Kentucky and Maryland, and for other purposes.
- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That the Allegheny Parkway is authorized to be established
- and administered in the manner hereinafter provided.
- 5 SEC. 2. The Secretary of the Interior is authorized to
- select the right-of-way for a parkway along the Allegheny
- Mountains extending from Hagerstown, Maryland, to Cum-
- 8 berland Gap National Historical Park, in the State of Ken-
- 9 tucky, including a branch connecting such parkway with administered and maintained by the Secretary of the Interior

- 1 Harpers Ferry, West Virginia, and a branch running through
- 2 New River Gorge to Hawks Nest; and he may acquire,
- 3 in such manner as he finds to be in the public interest, land
- 4 and interests in land for a right-of-way of sufficient width to
- 5 include the road and all bridges, ditches, cuts, and fills appur-
