- 3. Although you inadvertently gained information not intended for you, your signature below does NOT constitute an indoctrination of clearance or access to such information.

I hereby affirm that I have read, fully understand, and will comply with the above instructions for safeguarding national security information which was inadvertently disclosed to me. I certify that I shall never divulge anything which I may have learned from having been exposed to this information, nor will I reveal to any person whomsoever, my knowledge of the existence of such information. I further certify that I shall not henceforth attempt to gain access to such information. I understand that by providing my signature and the other requested information below, I am executing a lifelong agreement with the United States Government to protect the information to which I was inadvertently exposed, and that I am not being authorized clearance or access to national security information.
